

THE LARYNGOSCOPE EDITOR-IN-CHIEF SEARCH ANNOUNCEMENT

The Triological Society is seeking applicants for the next Editor-in-Chief of *The Laryngoscope*. Founded in 1896, *The Laryngoscope* is an internationally recognized scholarly journal dedicated to advancing the practice of otolaryngology through research and clinical activities. The position of Editor-in-Chief is a prestigious and honored role recognizing the individual's proven abilities and knowledge in the discipline of otolaryngology-head and neck surgery. *The Laryngoscope* journal is owned by the Triological Society and serves as the official journal of The Triological Society, the American Laryngological Association (ALA), and the American Broncho-Esophagological Association (ABEA).

The Editor-in-Chief has editorial responsibility for strategic, scientific and editorial leadership of the Journal; setting an editorial vision that builds upon the established scope of the Journal; and overseeing the timely and unbiased evaluation and selection of scientific articles and other editorial material published in the Journal. The Editor-in-Chief will build on current achievements, strengthen the journal's competitive position, and utilize the latest technology to develop editorial initiatives that generate content representative of the full spectrum of high-quality work conducted worldwide in otolaryngology – head and neck surgery. An understanding of the changing climate of journal publishing is key, including familiarity with issues related to online publication, open access, and social media. The Editor-in-Chief must be prepared to position *The Laryngoscope* for success in this shifting landscape.

Applicants must be Triological Society Active Fellows or Active Candidates and recognized leaders in otolaryngology and should have demonstrated significant leadership experience and prior service as Editor, Deputy, or Associate Editor of a peer-reviewed journal. The applicant selected will begin a transition process with the current Editor-in-Chief on or about July 1, 2019, and will assume the position on October 1, 2019. The Editor-in-Chief will be supported by a virtual journal office directing the work of the editorial team through the web-based submission and peer review system.

Interested individuals should submit an application package that includes:

- A letter stating interest in the position including a personal statement emphasizing how the applicant's experiences have prepared him/her for the role of Editor-in-Chief
- A description of the applicant's goals and vision for *The Laryngoscope*
- A current curriculum vitae
